This roundtable concludes the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Research Conference by bringing together the organisers of the eponymous PAIS event series to reflect on the future shape of EU politics in the wake of the vote for Brexit, the broader 'polycrisis' said to be engulfing the European Union, and the current pressure on multilateral institutions.
